





CORPORATE FLIGHT DEPARTMENTS HELPING CORPORATE FLIGHT DEPARTMENTS

The Partnership for Corporate Aviation is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving industry safety through collaborative training.



Partnership for Corporate Aviation Training

Objective

Strengthen corporate aviation influence at the grass roots level by telling the business aviation story while encouraging flight departments to be actively involved in the community

Create an opportunity for traditional corporate aviation departments to work together on common issues, interests and needs.

First Initiative

Improve training quality while driving down training costs

Broaden the choices for accomplishing training

Reduce time invested in training

Quality

Improve quality of training.

Current increasing regulations place a burden on flight department managers to use multiple vendors to comply with training requirements. Vendors currently have training solutions that fill the square but are lacking in quality, and take too long. PCAT meets these challenges by bringing required training in-house. We pool resources and work together to accomplish training requirements.

Choices!

Broaden the choice for accomplishing training.

PCAT finds subject matter experts in the field to share their knowledge with others. This approach gets away from canned vendor courses that may or may not meet the needs of the operator. Computer based training is the wave of the future, but it lacks the personal touch of a hands on instructor. We find the need of the operator and train to those specifications. The specifications may change from region to region depending on the operator.

Time has value!

Reduce the time invested in training.

PCAT places value on time. We compress courses with high impact information and open forum discussions. We put on 15 classes per day for individuals to choose from. At the end of the day, you may have taken up to 8 courses in one day. This type of format has a better value of time spent on the road. In most cases, you travel to take one course that may take all day to complete. Imagine taking that same trip 8 times to complete required training.

One voice affecting change!

Drive down training cost.

Traditional corporate aviation has lost its voice in the industry. Currently, we communicate individually to regulators, training vendors and suppliers. Imagine the effect we could have on pricing and quality of training if we all spoke as a whole. One voice affecting change.

PCAT can be that voice!





Regular Membership

Membership is limited to Traditional Corporate Aviation flight departments. It is a voting membership. The membership fee is *\$500.00* annually.

Charter Membership

A limited number of Charter Memberships are available to Traditional Corporate Aviation flight departments. Charter Memberships are voting memberships with additional benefits and require a one time donation of \$5,000.00.

Benefits of Charter Membership include free PCAT courses for up to five team members for two years (outside vendor courses excluded), abatement of \$500.00 annual membership renewal fee for two years, and Charter Membership recognition on the PCAT website.

Honorary Membership

A non-voting membership approved by unanimous consent of the Board of Directors.

No membership fees will be required with this membership.

Associate Membership

A non-voting membership open to certain other companies or individuals who are not active in a traditional corporate aviation flight department. Annual membership fee is \$1,000.00.
