

Executive Proclamation

State of South Dakota

Office of the Governor

Whereas, General Aviation and Community Airports play a critical role in the lives of our citizens, as well as in the operation of our businesses and farms; and,

Whereas, The state of South Dakota has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aerospace, aircraft manufacturing, educational institutions and aviation organizations, and community airports and airport operators; and,

Whereas, The South Dakota Department of Transportation has 72 public-use airports across the state, serving 2,247 pilots, and over 1,000 general aviation aircraft; and,

Whereas, According to the South Dakota State Aviation System Plan 2010-2030, the aviation industry as a whole supports over 7,000 jobs and provides \$250 million in wages. With agriculture as the largest industry in the state, agricultural spraying supports more than 300 jobs, and provides over \$10 million in income; and,

Whereas, General aviation contributes to the state's economy and medical care, transports goods to the state's Indian reservations, supports forest fire fighting, and boosts economic development for small communities; and,

Whereas, General aviation is integral to the state's response to emergencies and natural disasters, as well as a key component of business at South Dakota's commercial airports; and,

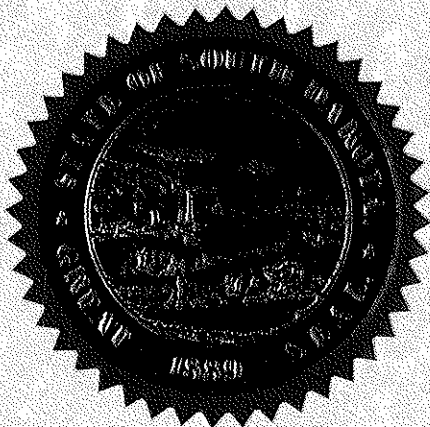
Whereas, The communities within South Dakota depend heavily on general aviation and community airports for the continued flow of commerce, tourism, and visitors to our state:
