

Mentoring the Generation NEXT

What is mentoring versus coaching..

Mentoring is a power free, two-way mutually beneficial relationship. This is usually not a person's supervisor.

Coaching develops specific skills for the task, challenges and performance expectations at work.





The "dyad"... Mentor and Mentee

There are 2 different but associated types of Mentorship:



Experience Transfer

To retain essential knowledge when experts retire or move jobs, or to transfer experience and knowledge across the business whenever there is a need.



Accelerated Development

Personal coaching & training to speed up the development of future experts in different geographic areas, and generally build the expertise within the industry.

- Harvesting/ Leaving a Legacy






Being a Mentor.. Mentoring can be used to...

Help acclimatise to the career path and/or work environment as it evolves;

- Facilitate better communication between different functions or management tiers;
- **Provide** support to isolated individuals;
- **Promote** and support changes in the culture of an organization;
- **Provide** support for a rapidly changing environment and the use of new technologies.




Mentoring Key Styles
