The vast majority of businesses in this community


– 97 percent – are small- to mid-size businesses

- S&P 500 Companies using business aviation outperform those that don't by 70%
- Business aircraft can reach about 5,000 airports, compared to about 500 for the airlines
- Companies using business aircraft out-perform non-users by 23% in revenue growth
- 98% of Fortune Magazine's Top 50 "World's Most Admired Companies" use business aviation

Ohio's aviation infrastructure makes it easy for companies in Buckeye State to utilize their aircraft. There are **150 general aviation airports** in Ohio, spread throughout the state.



These airports support over **17,000** jobs and contribute over **\$1.8** billion to the Ohio economy.

Even better, they give communities outside of major metropolitan areas access to the global economy — enabling companies in Findlay and Zanesville to be just as competitive as those in Cleveland or Columbus.
