

## PRECLEARANCE OPERATIONS IN IRELAND EFFECTIVE 11:59 EDT, MARCH 16, 2020

---

**The following procedures at Dublin and Shannon Preclearance locations in Ireland will be effective for flights departing after 11:59pm EDT on Monday, March 16, 2020**

- All commercial passenger flights utilizing preclearance in Dublin or Shannon must arrive at one of the 13 designated United States airports (“F-13 airports”) listed below.
  - Flights to airports other than the F-13 airports will not be allowed.
  - No general aviation flights will be cleared by Preclearance in Ireland.
- Only passengers who are U.S. citizens or others who fall under the exemptions of the President’s Proclamations will be able to travel to the United States.
- CBP Preclearance will perform normal Immigration, Customs and Agriculture checks.
- CBP will also be performing visual checks of passengers. Passengers exhibiting signs/symptoms of disease will be referred to Institute of Public Health in Ireland for additional screening, which will take place before the passenger is allowed to board the flight.
- The required medical screening will now take place at the F-13 airport upon arrival instead of at the preclearance location in Ireland, barring any health concerns identified prior to boarding.
- Upon arrival at one of the F-13 airports a mobile screening team will meet the aircraft.
- Precleared aircraft will still be able to land at a domestic gate; **HOWEVER**, passengers will be held on the aircraft until a mobile screening team arrives.
- Airlines must ensure that each person receives the current United States Traveler Health Declaration form prior to arrival; passengers must fill out the form prior to exiting the aircraft.
- The mobile screening team will screen passengers as they exit the aircraft. Passengers will not have to proceed to the CBP Federal Inspection Services (FIS) area unless otherwise instructed.

F-13 designated airports are: John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK), New York; Chicago O’Hare International Airport (ORD), Illinois; San Francisco International Airport (SFO), California; Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA), Washington; Daniel K. Inouye International Airport (HNL), Hawaii; Los Angeles International Airport (LAX), California; Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL), Georgia; Washington-Dulles International Airport (IAD), Virginia; Newark-Liberty International Airport (EWR), New Jersey; Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport (DFW), Texas; Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW), Michigan; Boston Logan International Airport (BOS), Massachusetts; Miami International Airport (MIA), Florida.
